## 7. INFORMATIONAL REPORTS

- A. Presentation from Mt. Diablo Audubon Brian Wilson and Nancy Wenninger, Mt. Diablo Audubon Society, presented a report on secondary poisoning of non-target animals from single feed rodenticides, specifically poisoning of raptors. The Audubon Society would like to work alongside the District to educate the public about the repercussions of secondary poisoning to non-target animals while providing alternative methods of rodent eradication. General Manager Downs added that while the District is willing to assist the Audubon Society by educating the public on Integrated Pest Management practices it is still necessary for our District to utilize rodenticides to protect public health.
- B. Annual Environmental Audit/CEQA Compliance Scientific Program Manager Steve Schutz, presented a summary of the 2012 Environmental Audit. The District adopted a mitigated negative declaration in 1999, which is a statement of best management practices we follow which we avoid or mitigate any potential environmental impact our programs may have. There were no significant changes to our program in 2012 that would have increased our environmental impact. This District, along with a consortium of Coastal Mosquito & Vector Control Districts, are in the process of acquiring a full Programmatic Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) from an environmental consulting firm to ensure that our program has the highest level of CEQA documentation possible. The template document can be tailored to each individual District's needs and is scheduled to be completed by early 2014.

A major component of our program continues to be biological control in the form of mosquitofish. District technicians continue to stock fish in neglected swimming pools and a variety of other sources. County residents are able to pick up mosquitofish for ornamental ponds on their property and other residential sources. Our program remains largely larval control orientated, although it is still necessary at times to adulticide due to high WNV activity. Pesticide use by

weight continued to decrease in 2012, due to ongoing reduction in the use of larvicidal oils in favor of bacterial larvicides and growth regulators as well as a cool, dry season which required fewer treatments.

- C. <u>West Nile Virus Update</u> Scientific Program Manager Steve Schutz, reported the only activity year to date was a positive bird in Los Angeles.
- D. Conference/Meetings Attended General Manager Downs reported that Trustee Wolcott attended the MVCAC conference in Sacramento and will present a summary at the May meeting. In NPDES Permit news: another house bill has been created, very similar to HR872, with a companion senate bill; however, this bill will not be introduced until the sequester is over. Progress on the District CEQA process is going well and analysis will begin on products used by the Districts to determine potential impacts. A public hearing will be held once the draft document is complete.
